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## DECENTRALIZATION IN UKRAINE: PROCESS, FEATURES, AND IMPACT ON LOCAL FINANCES AND SELF-GOVERNANCE

As is known, decentralization is the process of transferring power and financial resources from the central level to the local level of governance.
